Professionalism

Members should respect all forms of intellectual property. Ensure that all content shared respects copyrights, trademarks, and other legal rights. Plagiarism is strictly prohibited.

Evidence-based Discussions

Members should strive to base discussions on public health evidence. Misinformation, disinformation, or promotion of unproven theories or treatments is not permitted.

Non-commercial/Non-promotional

The Forums are not platforms for commercial promotion or personal gain. Members may not post promotional material, solicit business, or post links to their own or other's commercial activities.

Reporting Violations

Members who witness or experience conduct that they believe violates this code of conduct are encouraged to report it to the Forum moderators or administrators.
